1. The evidence for behavioral policies is insufficient.
2. Normative assumptions about rationality do not undermine the evidence base of behavioral policies.
3. Philosophical thinking about rationality is indispensable for successful behavioral policies.
4. The individuation challenge is both a methodological and a practical problem.
5. Qualitative research about agents' own perspectives should inform decision analysis.
6. Inter-disciplinary work can be of the highest academic quality and merit, even if it is lacking by the standards of one discipline or another.
7. Every PhD researcher should learn about and practice 'valorization' or 'knowledge utilization'.
8. Building arguments helps building businesses. Therefore, philosophers make excellent entrepreneurs.
